Women age 40+ who have not had a
mammogram within the last 2 yrs:

Albany County: 33.5%

Carbon County: 41.0%

Natrona County: 30.0%

Women who have not had a Pap smear
within the last 3 yrs:

Albany County: 14.6%

Carbon County: 24.8%

Natrona County: 16.2%

People age 50+ who report they have
never had a sigmoidoscopy or
colonoscopy:

Albany County: 49.8%

Carbon County: 60.3%

Natrona County: 41.9%

Why Are Cancer Screenings Important?

Some types of cancer can be found before they cause symptoms. Checking for cancer (or for conditions that may lead to cancer) in people who have no symptoms is called “screening.”

Screenings can help doctors find and treat some types of cancer early. Generally, cancer treatment is more effective when the disease is found early.

Basic screening tests (mammograms, pap tests, colonoscopies) are used widely to check for cancers of the breast, cervix, colon and rectum.

Early detection of cancers through screenings saves lives!

What is Wyoming Cancer Resource Services (WCRS) ?

The Wyoming Department of Health Comprehensive Cancer Control Program is committed to reducing the impact of cancer on all Wyoming citizens. As part of the statewide cancer control plan, the program has divided the state into 5 regions to implement regional-level cancer control through the use of the Wyoming Cancer Resource Service (WCRS) program.

The goal of each regional WCRS office is to increase the number of Wyoming residents who are being screened for cancer, decrease the number of people dying from cancer, collect essential data on communities with regard to cancer prevention and control, and provide patient navigation services for Wyoming citizens who are impacted by a cancer diagnosis.

How Can WCRS Assist You?

- Providing patient navigation to essential resource including screening resources, financial assistance, cancer information, and more. Access to resources is necessary for cancer patients, survivors, and caregivers throughout the continuum of cancer care.
- Public education and awareness about cancer prevention programs and services, as well as information relating to cancer risk factors.
- Educating the public about the need for early detection of cancer and promoting evidence-based screening guidelines.
- Identifying eligible Wyoming residents to free and low cost state-funded cancer screening programs (breast, cervical, and colorectal).
- Improving access to screening and treatment services by providing assistance with transportation costs, and scheduling appointments.
